



Sustainability on Campus

Office of Sustainability

All UNC System Universities were required to have a Chief Sustainability Officer as per the 2007 Sustainability Policy.

In 2015, UNCW created The Green Initiative Fund (TGIF), which is a \$5 yearly student fee which funds sustainability programs.

This includes the Sustainability Peer Educator program as well as grants for research on projects related to sustainability.

observers.




Raingardens
